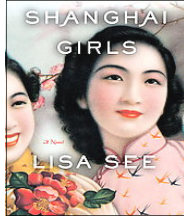


Do you enjoy reading & chatting about books? **Join RT Library BookChat**

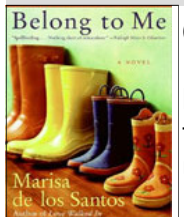
JUL 22 *Shanghai Girls* by Lisa See

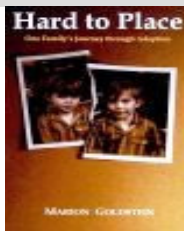
AUG 26 *Belong to Me* by Marisa de los Santos

True story of a NJ psychotherapist who adopted two "hard to place" brothers into her existing family with three children, and the challenges they faced through crises and hard times.

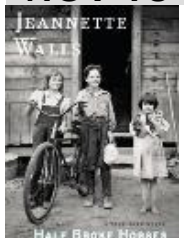
OCT 21 *The Gold Bug and other Stories* by Edgar Allan Poe
