What is an eBook? An electronic version of a published book you download using a program - Adobe Reader. Book read on a computer or portable reader device

Why read eBooks?

- Portable library: carry 350-10,000 books
- Large type options and some have speech-to-text
- Eco friendly: save paper, space and delete when done
- Annotate and bookmark books
- Search for definitions or more information while reading

What do I need to read eBooks?

- Windows or Mac computer
- Internet access
- For portable eBooks: reader device with USB plug
- For Reader/Nook device: install Adobe Digital Editions software before you download eBooks. <http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions>
- Library card (for catalog eBooks)
- Credit card or PayPal (to buy eBooks)
- Ability to download and copy a file

Differences between downloading eBooks from Library vs. Internet site

1) The Library Catalog eBook

Cost is Free with valid library card

Access through regular MAIN catalog <http://catalog.mainlib.org/>

ListenNJNW or Overdrive is the vendor for audiobooks and eBooks

Time Borrow book until due date (10-21 days which you choose) then expires

Availability Some titles always available, others place hold and wait list

Selection 500+ titles as of 2011 can borrow or hold up to 5 titles at a time

Overdrive Advantage Titles extra eBook copies for RT Library patrons only

Device Need EPUB format reader

Overdrive current list of eReader and mobile devices that work with catalog

Includes iPad, iPod Touch, iPhone, Android, nook, Sony Reader, Kobo, Blackberry

KINDLE DOES NOT WORK with EPUB and LIBRARY eBook FORMAT

File Has Digital Rights Mgmt encryption—File Expires and can't renew

You must delete expired file from your computer and device to remove it

Can return a library eBook early

Can't share or transfer a book

eBooks downloaded from Internet

Cost \$5.00+ avg. per title for new book

But Monthly free eBooks on retail sites and

Public domain titles (before 1923) are free

Time No expiration date

Availability Always available, free or pay

Selection: Many titles

Device Your choice Note EPUB or pdf format—Kindle has proprietary tech files

Ease of Downloading—Often one click purchase

File Free EPUB eBooks you can often copy & share—

purchased files, depends on seller: B&N allows limited time-dated sharing

Differences between eBook Readers (prices vary often)

1) Internet access: when USB plugged in only, wi fi, 3G

2) Screen: color vs. black & white, touch vs. toggle buttons, screen size

3) Memory: from 350 books up to add-on capacity to hold 10,000 books

4) eBook format—Most use EPUB format Kindle has custom azw format

5) Special features – Speech to text, search in text, definitions

6) Storage for ebooks- Kindle stores on Amazon account, others you are back-up
