Their general characteristics are activity, cleanly aspect, cheery temper, simplicity of dress and manner, economy of their own means and of their employer's, ability to perform what they profess to do in cookey and other service, adaptability, versatifity, eagences to learn, and a thorough will cy and other service, adaptability, versatility, eggenness to learn, and a thorough willingness to be taught. They know, for on thing, that they are not to be as expensively fed as their employees are, and so they cheerfully submit to simple means which literally would not "go down" with litritish or American servants; and this they largely assist in the household economy, which, if it exists at all, must begin in the kitchen. And with all these positive accomplialments, the best French servants willingly work for far less wages than we pay to our poorest "help."

If we insisted upon skilled servants, rad no others, we should get them; and much might be made, even of such material as now offers, if servants were paid only for what they can do, and are willing to learn to do.
