Soundings are Niagana.—A party of engineers consisting of twenty-one men and three assistants, are now at the Falls of Niegara, under charge of Mr. Tower. They have surveyed and rande accumete maps of the coast line about ten miles on each side of the Genessee River, while they are just fluishing the survey of the river from Lewiston to Navy Island. Here they have been unable to obtain as astisfactory soundings as at other points of the river. Very good results were obtained near the new Suppression Bridge. Directly under the bridge the lead showed a depth of 192 feet, while a short distance below the depth varied from 162 to 165 feet. The height of the American falls is 281 feet; this is an accurate measurement, as through the assistance of Conroy, the lead was placed at the base of the falls near the "Shadow of the Rock," The line of the falls is so ragged that any accurate measurement is extremely difficult.
