The Germany Mining Amor's states that the proprietors of most of the mines in the districts of Dortmand, Bonn, and Halle have been at considerable expense in providing for the use of workmon coming from a distance sleeping houses and cantenson. Nearly all these buildings have been erected upon the model of similar establishments belonging to the State at Szarbruck and cleewiere. The workmen are ledged in them and are provided with food from Saturday till Monday, and many of the unmarried are provided with fould from Saturilay itil Monday, and many of the unmarried men take up their residence in them attogether. These establishments have accommodation for from flity to three hundred persons each; and, as a general rule, the proprietors let them at a trifling rental to a contractor, who is bound to lodge the numerrod usen for a moderate sum, and to afford them facilities for cooking their meals in the honse.
