For two years they rounded about that region, living in caves in the woods, and subsisting on berries, roots, and the charity of the people, until they became so great a nuisance that they were stretched in Jackson Towniki, and in juil the discovery that the Rev. Mr. Lobdell, was a women, was made. A radistant from this section chanced to be in Strondburg, and informed the authorities that their prisconers were the missing paupors from Delhi.
