FARM NOTES.

GAPES IN HEENS AND CHICKENS.—A
some experience I am of the opinion
that frequent scratching in the mud
keeps in a goose, and the principal
cause of gapes in geese and fowls; and keep-
ing them away from such work a
ventilator.

HATCHING CHICKENS.—I do not hit
the shell of eggs when the time has
come for chicks to hatch, or try to keep them
from the shell, for if they are not to
come forth it is far better to let them
die. In my experience, they never
