KEEPING GRASSES FRESH FOR WINTER
Use.—If you desire delicious, fresh grasses in winter and spring, they can be had by a very little care and expense.

Stack the bunches on a dry, warm day, and turn them over to cool, shady place for three days; then stack them in paper, paper boxes, holding about 100 bunches between the layers place a single layer of newspaper; the boxes should contain more than three layers in thickness. Then place in a cool, dry room, not in a cellar, for the dampness will cause mould and decay.
