In the winter scaon a little cabbage ent up and given to them is beneficial. It is often said that fowls must have fresh meat in winter to make them lay. That is not so, as my forty years' experience has fully proved; yet when one has any cheap meat, as shearly sheads, or otherwise it is well to give it to his fowls. But the most important matter is to keep before the fowls, under cozer, ashes and sand mixed, and put into a shallow box for the fowls to wallow in to keep them free of lice; also a supply of gravel, old mortar and a supply of gravel, old mortar and ground oystershells, as aids in the formation of eggs.

4—'How should their rocating house be constructed?'' A house about 8:20 feet will suffice for fifty or accenty-five fowls. That has been my experience; but if your fowls do have the roup, remove the sick fowls immediate by to a separate yard where they can be roup, remove the sack fowls immediate-by to a separate yard where they can be nursed. Let them have clean, dry quar-ters, and so far from the other fowls that the contagion cannot spread to them. All of this may fail to effect a cure, as no certain care for roup in all cases has ever been discovered.


