A Monument to the Late Wm. Rankin.

As a public educator no man in Nor-  
thern New Jersey ever performed as  
much labor or achieved as great success  
as the late Wm. Rankin of Mendham.  
We therefore cheerfully publish the fol-  
lowing circular which has been sent to  
1,200 of his former pupils—all those ad-  
dresses can at present be ascertained.  
But there are without doubt hundreds  
of others who profited under or by reason  
of his teaching who would like to  
contribute to this worthy memorial to a  
noble man, and we publish the cir-  
cular, knowing that we will perhaps reach

TO THE PUPILS OF THE LATE WILLIAM  
RANKIN, A. M.

A Monument to the Late Wm. Rankin.

A meeting of a number of his former  
pupils was held at the office of Elwood  
C. Harris, in Newark, on the 24th of  
March last. In the course of a full and  
free discussion, the following facts, most  
of them already familiar to all, were  
presented:  
During a long life Mr. Rankin gave  
himself to teaching with singular devo-  
tion and success. His ability and schol-  
arship, his original and striking methods  
of instruction and illustration, his honest  
selfishness and generosity, his honesty  
and purity of character, and his sturdy  
energy of purpose, gave him a powerful  
influence in forming the character of his  
pupils, as well as in imparting knowl-  
edge, and in training and disciplining  
their mental powers.  
Devoting himself wholly to his chosen  
work, whatever he earned beyond the  
necessaries of his daily bread was expended  
in and for his school, and in helping  
those students who, but for his aid,  
would have been unable to continue  
their course of study. Many now filling  
positions of respectability, and unac-  
quainted with him from that aid and en-  
couragement, without which they could  
not have succeeded. Thus he lived at  
poverty, and died as he lived, leaving  
nothing behind him but the record of a  
noble and unselfish life wholly devoted  
to the good of others. Few have done  
so much for the world and received in  
return so little of its rewards. His wid-  
ow, "long the partner" of his toils,  
whom all remember with deep gratitude  
and affection, is left in her old age and  
tenderly dependent upon others, while his  
body rests in an unmarked grave in the  
cemetery at Mendham.

A Monument to the Late Wm. Rankin.

It was unanimously resolved to place  
a substantial monument over his grave.  
To accomplish this, an association was  
formed, by electing Samuel A. Farrand,  
President, Elwood C. Harris, Secretary,  
and Wm. A. Righter, Treasurer, and the  
undernamed were appointed an  
Executive Committee, with full power  
to carry out the above plan. The help of  
his former pupils will contribute from  
one to five dollars—or more—enough  
will be raised to erect a substantial mon-  
ument and to make an acceptable pre-  
sent to Mrs. Rankin.
