Water for the Eyes.

A writer in Frazer's Magazine thinks that whatever hesitation there may be justly called for in recommending one or another of the lotions new so popular there need be no such don't in respect to cold water as a remedy. He says in cases of much inflammation, or difficulty of opening the eyes in the morning, experienced by so many, the water should be warm, and it may be mixed with warm milk, but in nearly all cases it should be cold.
