



The new Museum of Natural History, with its imposing facade locking over the bill and dale of the Park, clances outlines most cities while waiting to be attorned in their advance. The anticipations that led to the grading and paving of the streets have had a very limited fruition in isolated rows of pretentious and rectangular "brownlimited Iruition in isolated rows or pretentious and rectangular "brownstone fronts," which seem oddly out of place. Here and there a vestige of old times remains in a pre-metropolitan homestead, with an improvershed orchard around it, or in a grand manion with a classic front of Doric columns, and a granests' far a-red-time ifth avenue. But it is not the new buildings, premonitory of the city's advance, nor the old ones reflecting the past nor these two in contrast, that give the region its characteristics and pouliar interest. All down in the hollews between the graded streets, and in spaces where, no streets have been opened, the gray Laurentine rook stands with but a superficial layer of soil upon it, thousands of acres are under cultivation by squatters, and without other inclosure to the land than the embankments formed around the hollows by the trap-rock foundations of the streets. 
