Common Council meets next Monday
evening.

The Del. Lack. & Western, Great
Western of Canada, and Washoe Pacific
Railroads have entered into a traffic ar-
rangement to last for twenty years.

The total gross tonnage of iron ore
passing over the High Bridge Branch of
the Central Railroad for the month of
September was 10,924 tons and 12 cwt.

The Mine Hill mill also suffered their
first defeat last Saturday—a picked nine
from Elmhurst, M. Hope and Mr. Pleas-
ant beating them by a score of 29 to 14.

The roof of the Union Foundry, at
Rockaway, caught fire in the roof one
night last week, but the flames were
discovered in time to be easily extin-
guished.

The annual session of the Synod of
New Jersey, which comprises all the
Presbyterian churches in the State, will
be held at Bridgeton on October 19th,
20th and 21st.

The officials of the Erie and Delaware,
Lackawanna and Western Railroad com-
panies are considering the advisability
of erecting a union depot at the foot of
Twelfth street, Jersey City.

No tidings have as yet been received

weeks since he disappeared.

are the only requisites for the native-born.

about to enlarge his fine summer resi-
dence at Lake Hopatcong. Plans are
also out for three more cottages which
friends of Mr. Edwards contemplate
building at the lake.

The trial of Congressman Charles H.
Voorhis, charged with the embezzle-
ment of \$5,000 of the Bergen County
Water Company's funds, has been pos-
tponed to the December term of the
Court of Oyer and Terminer. Mr. Voor-
his furnished bail for his appearance.

An agent of S. V. Olsen & Co. was in
town on Tuesday making arrangements
to establish a petroleum oil depot on the
outskirts of the town. Such depots have
already been located at Madison and
Morristown, and the company proposes
to construct them at Newton, Hackensack,
town, Washington and other places.

Protection Hook and Ladder Com-
pany of Dover, received by express last
Saturday a box containing a fine ban-
ner bearing the words, "Welcome to
our Brave Protectors." It was neatly
bordered with ferns and was accompan-
ied by a horse shoe made of greens and
scarlet berries. The gift came from two
ladies of that hospitable town.

Judge Magle, of the judicial district,
evidently has not much love for men
who elope with other men's wives. On
Monday, in the Somerset Court, he
sentenced a fellow who had eloped with
a married woman to six months impris-
onment and the costs of the court, and
expressed his regret that the law would
not allow him to make the penalty
greater.

The Giant Powder Company's mill at
McGinnville burned down Wednesday
afternoon of last week. The fire was
caused by a spike that got in with some
soda that was being ground. The flame
burst out so suddenly that the engineer,
Birdworthy, and assistant, Tharp, were
severely scorched. The company have
had a large brick mill built this summer
which is all finished but the roof, which
is to be of iron and slate. The iron
work is to come from Wilmington, Del.,
and has not arrived yet.—Jerseyman.
