The National Elections.

Once more the nation has spoken, and its voice again shows the confidence of the people of our great country in the Republican party. The Democrats went into the canvass hampered by the two great weights of a solid South and Free Trade. Valiantly they tried to explain these away, and to make their platform acceptable to the majority of our people. But the people would not be deceived, and their faith rested in those who offered them a consistent platform, and in the party whose candidates and whose past record showed that it could be trusted with the administration of national affairs. The canvass has been an exciting one, but its result proves again that a free and enlightened people needs only fair play before the public mind, and will not be misled by the wiles of a crafty and unscrupulous minority. The Republican victory is the people's victory, not the victory of any section of the country or of any class of our citizens.

Two things are noted by the elections. First, that the business of the country has nothing to fear from Congressional interference. The election of the House and Senate is the result of the questions of finance and tariff, and that they will be met wisely, and as not to disturb our national prosperity. Secondly, the solid South is likely to disappear as a disturbing element in national affairs. With a Republican executive, and a Republican working majority in both Houses of Congress, we need no longer fear that Southern war claims will be pressed for payment.

These great results have been brought about, not by party hatred or personal prejudice, but by the deliberate judgment of the sober thinking people of the country.

Two great lessons can be learned from General Hancock's unfortunate candidacy. The first is an old one: that the presidency is the gift of a great and free people, and is not to be attained by planning or striving for it. James A. Garfield, who did not seek the presidency, but has now given him by the enlightened choice of the American people.
