

Feed sonked corn, that is, corn which is cov sonace core, that is, early which is covered with as much boiling water as i will take up in twenty-four hours. This is better for either fattening or stone pigs (fan coarse mea), unless the latter be thoroughly cooked.

New York, December 14.—The func-ral services for Dr. Wilbur F. Sanford. of Greenpoint, L. I., who died of diptheria on Sunday morning, Dec. 12th, were performed in his native place, Middle-town, Conn. Dr. Bantord was only 88 years old, but he had attained an em nent position in his profession. All the people of Greenpoint seem to mouch his loss, especially as he lost his life in trying to save that of a patient. Two weeks previous Dr. Sanford was called to the bedside of a child suffering with diptheria. It was a very malignant case, and Dr. Sanford watched the child das, and night. At last the air passages were filled up, and the child would have been choked to death had not Dr. Sanford who had his knife in hand, immediately made an opening in the wind-pipe, through which, with a small rub-ber tube, he drew out with his own mouth the poisonous fluid. He pro-longed the life of the child for several hours by the operation, but sacrificed his own life. This way of conducting such an operation is regarded by all engrous as extremely hexardons to the operator. Three French surgeons are known to have lost their lives in the ame way.
